## A preliminary study on the abundance of butterfly species in Rani reserve forest and Maliata hills of Kamrup District, Assam

Rumi Kalita, Assistant professor (part-time) Dakshin Kamrup College, Mirza-781125, Kamrup, Assam

Abstract: The aim of the study is to have a primary calculation of butterfly species of two areas of Kamrup district of Assam i.e.; Rani Reserve forest and Maliata hills in different seasons throughout the current year. Earlier studies found out 40 species of different families of butterflies from this area. It is assumed that several species are still to be described. Nymphalidae butterflies were most abundant with 20 species in the region and Rani Reserve forest harbors more species than Maliata hills as found during the study. The environment of the two areas stated have high capability to support enormous varities of Lepidoptera species.

Key words: butterfly, nymhalidae, lepidoptera

#### Introduction:

The member of Indian butterflies reported in one fifth of total amount of the world butterfly species (Kunte 2000, Evans 1992). The total number of butterfly species observed from the Indian region is about 1504, one of which is about 962 species of butterfly belonging to five taxonomic families from Assam region alone. Doubleday(1845) seems to be the first person to work on butterflies in the state when he worked in northern Assam covering the areas of Sadia, Jorhat and Cachar followed by Moore(1857) who worked in Abor hills and Mishimi hills including Sadia(Bora&Meitei, 2014), a number of studies were done in various pockets of Guwahati city. Assam to ascertain the number butterfly species (Ali &Basistha 2000; Barma et al, 2015, Saikia et al. 2015). The eastern Himalaya is one of the richest areas of butterfly species within Indian subcontinent 58% of the butterflies that occurring in Indian subcontinent and Myanmar are found in eastern Himalayas as well as in north east India alone(Evans, 1932). The main reason of the phenomenal diversity in the region having unique biogeographic location at the junction of Indian and indo Chinese sub regions, the greatest diversity of plants is the major influence on butterfly distributions, diversity and abundance(Vidya 1996; Kakati 2006). Butterflies beside being recognized important resources in aesthetics, educational and environmental investigations are now considered as ecological indicators.

#### Objectives of the study:

- 1. To access the diversity of butterfly fauna.
- To calculate the abundance of butterfly species.
- 3. To identify and scrutinized the species of butterfly which are of conservation importance

The Rani reserve forest area is about 43.70 km<sup>2</sup> as per Reserved register and falls under Rani range of east Kamrup Forest division, Kamrup District, Assam is about 15 km south-west of Guwahati, Assam. The region lies between 91°35'-91°45'E longitude and 26°0'-26°.10N latitude. It is one of the oldest and largest reserved forests in
